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## Additional Activities and Assignments

1. **Student Exercises Related to Objectives**
  - Objective #1: Distribute lists of words composed of acronyms, homonyms, and eponyms. Assign students to identify each type of word. Give extra points to students who can name or supply other words that qualify.
  - Objective #2: Lead the pronunciation of various words with the students.
  - Objective #3: Assign students to compose words using the lists of combining words. (Be prepared for originality!) After demonstrating combining words, give students a list of prefixes denoting quantity or number, color, size or degree, location or direction, condition; another list of root words; and a list of suffixes used as adjectives, indicators of condition, or agents and concerned persons, indicators of medical terms or processes or uses (students can download word lists on CourseMate).
  - Objective #4: Distribute a list of words and ask the students to break apart each word and determine its definition. Start with easier terms and progress to more complex words to build the students' confidence.
  - Objective #5: Distribute lists of words in either singular or plural form. Ask the students to first say if the word shown is singular or plural, then change to the alternate form of the word on the list.
  - Objective #6: From the list of words you distribute, have students break the terms into word parts and give the meaning for the word. Ask the students to write a sentence that includes each of the words properly.
